We are indeed privileged to host esteemed Dartmouth Professor and New England author Ernest Hebert to the library on November 30 at noon. Mr. Hebert will lead the discussion of his honored book The Old American which won the 2000 Outstanding Fiction Award from the New Hampshire Writer's Project.

NPR interviewer Alan Cheuse of All Things Considered described The Old American as "a beautifully developed reconstruction of life on the New England/Canadian frontier."

Set during the French and Indian War, the novel introduces us to Nathan Blake from Keene, who is abducted by the Algonquin Indians and held in Canada as a slave. For both men a daunting future looms.
